

Appraisal reports convey opinions and conclusions that are to be based on credible market support. However, the reality is that this does not always occur. USPAP requires the appraisal to have market support, sound reasoning and logic for adjustments in a comparison analysis, all components in a cost analysis and the multiple aspects of an income analysis. This program will address the need for meaningful market analysis for properties that commonly transact and are located in relatively stable markets, using industry approved and peer tested techniques within the Six Step process. This program will focus on how this can be accomplished in an inferred market study.

Each year, the South Florida Chapter sends representatives to LDAC, Leadership Development Advisory Council event in Washington D.C. This year's event occurred May 17 -19, 2023. Most Appraisal Institute chapters send representatives to collaborate about pre-planned discussion topics. The representatives attend for a three-year cycle. Attendees are a diverse group, and offer professional opinions based on their experiences regarding the current appraisal industry.

The format is divided between collaboration sessions with current topics and the legislative agenda. This year's session topics were:

- Articulating the Value of Al Professionals, Discussion Leader Bo Bass
- Professional Development Programs, Discussion Leader Smedmore Bernard
- The Appraisal Gap, Discussion Leader Jorge Barreiro
- Modernization: Advancing solutions that result in positive changes for yourself, your chapter, and the Appraisal Institute, Discussion Leader
 Molly Skipper Steele

Articulating the Value of Al Professionals discussion opinions included connecting with other professional groups such as realtors, real estate managers, and lawyers, etc. Discussion points:

- . Find ways to bring in new members that are not appraisers to help spread the message/value of Appraisal Inst.
- Inviting non-members to events to network and connect with non-members
- Discussed potential slogans or mottos to assists designated members such as the "Designated Difference"

Professional Development Programs discussion centered around the program benefits, how to make the existing programs better, more user-friendly regarding application to actual practices, possible new program areas for development, and how to advertise the programs. Additional points discussed were:

- Lunch and Learn programs with contractors, attorneys, developers etc.
- Attorneys receive continuing education credits for teaching courses. Why not have an attorney teach a course on litigation appraisals with depositions
- Argus Enterprise training was deemed to expensive to realistically be offered
- Appraisal Institute offering a Business Development course

Appraisal Gap discussion offered opinions regarding current market conditions relating to value, cost inflation, cap rate changes. This discussion was the broadest discussion which did not seem to gain much traction.

Modernization: Advancing solutions that result in positive changes for yourself, your chapter, and the Appraisal Institute discussion centered around technology issues including data. Points discussed:

- Utilizing AI, ChatGPT and other tools to make work more efficient
- Evolving with the times and technology. Embrace instead of opposing

The topics change every year, yet some overlap with prior year's topics. During the latest three-year cycle, 2019, 2022, and 2023, some of the topics included Al Membership Benefits, Insurance, New Member Recruitment, Technology, Diversity Initiatives – Residential appraisal discrimination, Evaluation legislation, and others.

An area of discussion for almost a decade and finally implemented is PAREA - Practical Applications of Real Estate Appraisal. PAREA provides an alternative to the traditional supervisor and trainee model for experience for licensed residential and certified residential appraisers. Appraisal Institute (AI) PAREA is an online program covering appraisal theory and methodology, in real-world simulations, with mentoring from nationally recognized appraisers. All has announced September 2023 as a state date and is looking for volunteers to administer the program.

The second portion of the LDAC experience is the Legislative Agenda, including Congressional and Senate lobbying meetings. This year's lobbying efforts focused on the PAL Act, H.R. 2771, the Portal for Appraisal Licensing Act of 2023 ("PAL Act"). The legislation would create a "cloud-based" portal for licensing payments, applications, and background checks in one system for state sharing. South Florida representatives met with Congressman John Rutherford, Senator Rick Scott, and Senator Mark Rubio. The legislative bill has multiple, bipartisan co-sponsors.

Candidate Guidance



Effective January 1, 2023, any education needed to earn an Al designation (a.k.a. designation education) will no longer be a component but instead a prerequisite to the Candidate for Designation program.

As such, individuals seeking AI Designated membership who *are not already* Candidates for Designation must complete all required education to be eligible to enter the **Candidate for Designation** program. AI Admissions recommends that these individuals join AI as a Practicing Affiliate, complete all required education, then become a Candidate for Designation.

Al Admissions, with the permission of the ADQC chair, recently granted timeline extensions (12/31/2023) to Candidates whose timelines end either this year or sometime in 2023. These Candidates must complete all required education prior to the expiration of this timeline extension date (12/31/2023) to remain in the **Candidate for Designation** program.

Candidates who **do not** complete the required education (**on the most current designation path**) by this timeline extension date of 12/31/2023 may not remain Candidates, however, they may transition to the Practicing Affiliate category until they can complete the outstanding education requirements and retransition into the Candidate for Designation program. This policy also applies to Designated members earning additional designations. (Designated members would remain Designated members but would no longer be enrolled in a Candidate for Designation program.)

Individuals may retain credit for any previously completed designation requirements (if applicable) if the completion date is no older than 20 years at the time of entry into the **Candidate for Designation** program or upon approval of an additional four-year extension.

Note: Annual Minimum Progress is no longer a condition of the Candidate for Designation program.
